Smartscape is an affordable, comprehensive training program that has taught hundreds of landscape professionals in Arizona about the most current water-efficient horticultural practices for the last 17 years. It serves as a model program that educates landscape professionals along with consumers on the importance of low-water-use landscapes. These concepts are particularly important in arid regions where water is an increasingly scarce and valuable resource. In the Phoenix Metro Area, the Smartscape workshop series is offered by the University of Arizona Cooperative Extension, Maricopa County and the Arizona Municipal Water Users Association. In the Tucson area, Smartscape is offered by the UA Cooperative Extension in Pima County and Tucson Water. The workshop series provides consistent core instruction in the design, installation, and maintenance of water efficient landscapes and irrigation systems. Advanced Smartscape modules are offered in order to provide additional training in these core topics. Classes are designed for property managers, landscape professionals, nursery personnel, landscape architects and designers, parks and recreation personnel, and HOA board members. The individual classes and materials are tailored to suit regional differences while the University connection keeps the program current with the most up-to-date, non-biased, research based information available. Smartscape is also designed to help graduates market their knowledge. This is accomplished through an online directory, a certificate of completion, and promotional items such as a logo lapel pin and logo decals. As a result, graduates are better able to promote their specialized skills and knowledge, giving them a competitive edge in challenging economic times.
